The Bottom Line & A Hard Truth by Hayley Brown, Manager

Barnabas Safe and Sound have been supporting young people since 2001, initially for those aged 16 to 25 in housing crisis, we then introduced youth work as a means to give skills and advice to young people to prevent homelessness. Prevention is the key word here, this seems to be a word that has been lost over the last 10 years. With endless cuts in funding to frontline services - most of which worked with young people to give them the skills and resilience they need to become active members of their communities. Budgets and targets set are now focused on paying for things once they've gone wrong - at a greater cost to the public purse.

For example; in a recent report from the National Youth Agency, The Social Cost of Youth Work Cuts: Preventing Youth Offending through Youth Work, highlights that it cost 4 times more (£200,000) for a young person to enter the youth justice system, than one who doesn't. In terms of homelessness, research by Homeless Link tells us that in 2022/2023, 136,000 young people aged 16-24 presented as homeless - and this just the people they knew about. Whilst our supported accommodation project offers crisis point support, which is a more expensive service, this is still a cheaper option, and offers a financial benefit to the public purse. For every £1 spent on supported accommodation £3.50 is saved.

Why does all of this matter? Is it just about public spending? Or do we all have a greater responsibility to ensure our young people get the best start in life and have the skills and understanding to do this? In the 19 years I have delivered youth work in Morpeth, I have seen the long term benefits of the work that we did years ago. Those young people are now adults, they have jobs, homes and children. Many of those young people had little faith that this could happen for them. The projects and opportunities available to all young people were in abundance with fully funded services and teams of experienced and qualified youth workers.

It is time for prevention to take centre stage again. There needs to be a change in thinking at local and national level. Every day I see reports on increases in young people mental health issues, homelessness, and crime/ anti social behaviour. These issues have always been there, but now there are less services and funding available to work with young people before it hits crisis point.

Young people are at the heart of what we do as a Charity - they are our future, and it's absolutely essential that our community supports them on that journey to adulthood.

LASP Outdoors



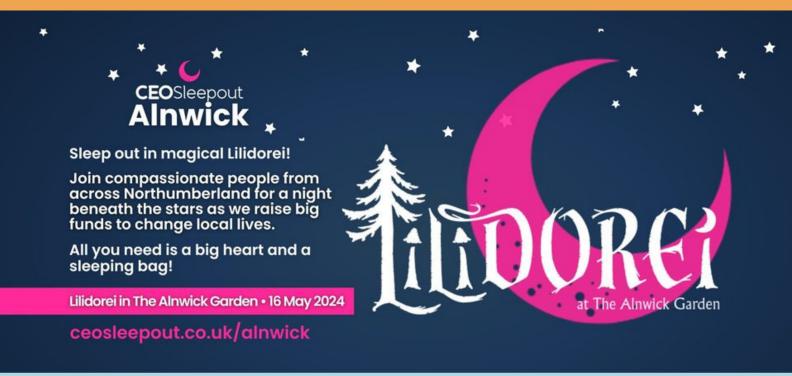
